Tuscanos: Wednesday Night, Tuscanos is the place to be! 20 percent of our dinner proceeds are donated back to the amateur club. Great food great drinks and a fun time for all. Be sure to call for reservations, as we fill the house!

Maltby Café: Maltby Café is a breakfast must! The Maltby Cafe is located in the lower portion of an old schoolhouse which was built in 1937, as the gymnasium and cafeteria for the main school next door, which was built in 1907. Known for its homemade country flavor, huge portions, and super staff, your visit to the Maltby Cafe will be a one of a kind experience.

Cabbage Patch: The Cabbage Patch, also known as *Blackman House Museum*, will please you with tasty chicken pies, eggs benedict and cabbage soup topped off with amazing homemade pies.

Lewis and Main: Lewis and Main offers the best in American Farmhouse cuisine made with fresh local ingredients, while also serving craft beer, local wines, and carefully selected spirits. It's a restaurant that welcomes you in, whether you are wearing heels or cowboy boots.

Oxford Saloon: The Oxford Saloon in Snohomish was built in the 1900s. This lively saloon offers burgers and sandwiches, plus live music and a few ghosts.

The Repp in Snohomish: The Repp offers Northwest fare made from scratch, a happy hour and frequent live music at a brick-walled restaurant and bar.

Jake's Café: Jake's Café, located on 2nd street in Snohomish, is a low-key joint with vintage accents, serving typical daytime American eats from omelettes to burgers. Fun and Funky.

Sky River Bakery: Sky River Bakery bakes with all natural ingredients you can pronounce. Everything is made in-house from scratch. Serving excellent pastries, cookies and scones and now serving lunch. Check hours before heading over.

Bistro at Hollywood Schoolhouse: Bistro at Hollywood Schoolhouse in Woodinville is a low-key bistro restaurant which hides behind the stately brick schoolhouse that now serves as the area's central landmark and as a satellite tasting room for Maryhill Winery. The bistro has a subtle filling station vibe and a menu of comfort foods such as BLTs, bacon-wrapped dates, even chicken pot pie.

The Herb Farm: At the Herb farm, every meal is a production. The longtime fine dining staple occupies a chintz-draped cottage that looks like an extension of the garden and farm that fuel its themed meals. The restaurant, on the edge of the Willows Lodge grounds, is hard into pageantry, but the meals themselves are worth the ovation that usually concludes each night's presentation.
